HAMLETS

The Monthly Meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 20th July 2022; in the Community Centre at 7:30pm. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), J Phipps (Vice-Chair), K Boundy, J Payne, N Steer, G Worden, S Tilbey, K Jones & C Myers, two members of the public and S Rosser (Clerk). Cllr. R Savage sent apologies.

County Councillor Tilbeys report covered the recent Devon & Cornwall Police and Crime Commissioner meeting where the draft annual report was presented. Comments can be made on this. News that the Bude Enquiry Office at the Police Station will re-open from 22nd November between 1000 & 1500 Monday to Saturday. Also, news that the three Cornwall Councillors have been in talks with the Cornwall Citizens Advice Bureau; to help find ways to bring the service back to Bude.

There were many items of Parish matters & maintenance discussed such as: hedges/verges, footpath provision, noticeboard repair costs, replacement Union Flag purchase, the initial research to explore funding for a Multi Use Games Area & feedback from the 'Meet the Leader' session. A survey for the MUGA was approved and will be advertised via the parish website, Facebook group and here in the Hamlets. A copy can also be found on the noticeboard. The 'Meet the Leader' session was felt to be positive and firmly put North Cornwall on the map. Further investigation into prices for noticeboards was brought back to the meeting – tenders are sought for the repair and upgrade by 10th September. The toilets at Duckpool toilets have now re-opened in conjunction with The National Trust. Please see the draft minutes in full on the website for further details. 31 items of correspondence were noted.

Five planning applications were received for comment since the last full council meeting in July 2022. Councillors with interests left the building & took no part in the respective discussions. PA22/05630 Proposed Dwelling with variation of condition 2 of decision PA16/07677 dated 28/10/20216; Land North West of Lower Woodford, Woodford, Morwenstow, Bude. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council feel that the application is substantially different to what was presented in 2016. However, would like to support the application. PA22/05634 Proposed dwelling without compliance with condition 2 of decision notice PA16/07678 dated 28/10/2016; Land North West of Lower Woodford, Woodford, Morwenstow, Bude MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council feel that the application is substantially different to what was presented in 2016. However, would like to support the application. PA22/04864 Demolition of existing agricultural barn and two residential conversions, and for the erection of a detached dwelling and attached double garage; Land West of Killarney Farm, Morwenstow, Bude, Cornwall MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council would like to support the application. PA22/05066 & PA22/05868 Listed Building Consent to erect small lean-to conservatory at the side of the house to provide a dining area. Install en-suite facilities in third bedroom. Remedial works to render on outside of building; Sunshine Alley, Crosstown, Morwenstow, Bude. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council found difficulty in understanding the plans fully; however, the accompanying photographs demonstrate that the characteristic of the proposal - would fit with the adjoining properties.

The next regular Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 21st September 2022. All are welcome to the meetings.

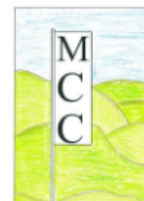

Dear Mr Hobbs,

**A Social History Project by the people of Bude Areas, for the people of Bude Area.
Because our stories must not be forgotten.**

We are writing to you to invite you to be part of large social history project about Bude and surrounding areas. We are planning to capture our history and heritage, before all the memories and stories are lost. We have such a unique history and heritage in Bude, that it would be a travesty for people not to be able to have their memories recorded. The outcome will be to see a large 'Coffee Table' style book, published, pod casts, speaking signs, art projects and theatre production representing the stories told.

We are reaching out to as many people, parishes, groups, clubs, organisations and businesses as possible to invite them to contribute to the project by way of telling us their memories, sharing documents and photos, illustrations and recipes to create a lasting legacy for Bude area. The two eras are The Ration Years, 1939-1954 and The Pandemic, 2020-2022 as two pivotal moments in history. We have enclosed some leaflets which explain everything fully and trust that you will distribute and share this information with people and groups who have a story to tell. Collectively, all this information will create a wonderful insight into the lives of people in Bude during times when the world was in crisis.

We are asking your parish to take part specifically as some of you will have a broad depth of valued memories and stories of the Local area. We feel your input to this would be of huge historic and important value to this project. Perhaps you could mention this in your parish newsletter for us, please.

The project will take about two years to complete, to take the time to research and collect all the social history information from many sources and collate them. Our first target is to video/audio record interviews with people who recall our unique area between 1939-1954. This covers social activity during the Second World War and the rebuilding of the country during peace time. Great Britain remained on rations until 1954, nine years after the War.

If you are happy to be involved and see this project as important to gather memories and stories that will otherwise be lost, please do get in contact with us. We have a small committee and a lot of volunteers working together. It is a massive undertaking. Please do email us and we can arrange times to interview and take photos.
