The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 15th March 2023; in the Community Centre at 7:30pm. Present were: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), J Phipps, N Steer, J Payne, C Myers, K Boundy, K Jones, G Worden, S Rosser (Clerk) and one member of the public. Apologies were received and accepted from: Cllrs. S Tilbey & R Savage.

C.Cllr Tilbey was attending the Community Housing meeting at Heartlands, Redruth on behalf of both the Parish and County Councils. In hope that we may be able to help our local community with much needed affordable housing. With this in mind – no report of the County Council was received.

Parish matters & maintenance were discussed with the main feature being King Charles III Coronation Celebration details. As previously reported a Bring & Share Lunch will take place at the Community Centre on Sunday 7th May. Please see the MCC Committee poster within, for further details. There will be both art and fancy-dress competitions for all ages, whereby you could win a commemorative mug. There is a gift for every Parishioner to mark this occasion; Councillors will be busy delivering these to every household, in the days coming up to the event. You may be asked how many people are in your household to ensure that everyone has one.

The community emergency plan is making good progress as reported by Cllrs. Phipps & Steer. If you would like to volunteer to be part of this – please do get in touch.

The application to the Levelling up fund for the 'The Health & Wellbeing Project' is rolling over to year 2. The procurement process has been completed.

Various policies and documents were reviewed in preparation for the AGAR statements. Finances were agreed for payment.

There were three planning applications to provide consultee responses on: PA23/01289 Variation of Condition 2 (approved plans) of Application No. PA22/04819 dated 20th October 2022 (Proposed new build residential unit on site of existing outbuilding) - Chapel Barn Shop Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9SQ MPC Comment: Morwenstow Parish Council have no objections to this proposal. PA23/01324 Two-storey extension to rear (Western elevation) of existing house - Valley View Woolley Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9PW MPC Comment: Morwenstow Parish Council have no objections to this proposal.

PA23/02791 Replacement of existing garage with proposed garage and office above - Dits Barn, West Gooseham Farm Morwenstow Bude MPC Comment: Morwenstow Parish Council see no reason to object to the proposal. However, would request to see a condition to restrict the use - as per the proposal description.

MAY NATURE NOTES

Writing this in the 3rd week of April & with the night temperatures in the low single figures just explains the meaning of a blackthorn winter.

Primroses again this year have given us a real sign of spring, but are nearing the end of their long flowering season & being replaced on dry roadside hedges by the bright white flowers of Stitchwort and round foam like flowerheads of shepherds' purse.

In damper areas & permanent pasture, Ladys smock or cuckoo flower on slender stems stand well above the lower vegetation with their white pink veined flowers & when found in patches look just like a layer of cloud. Also, Bluebells & Early Purple Orchids are beginning to appear. There are several Orchid species and dependent on the soil type will follow during the rest of the summer. Orchids are dependent on fungi for reproduction & cannot be transplanted, so please do not be tempted to get out your spade to dig them up as some people have done with coloured primrose. Nature's garden is for everyone to enjoy.

I have also had reports of flowering shrubs that have been removed, stolen, from resident's roadside hedges, after they had bought & planted them to enhance the beauty of our Parish.

Don't forget to keep an eye out for the emerging leaves on the Oak & Ash trees which some say predicts the summers rainfall.

St. Mark's C of E Academy

SIAMS inspection

St. Mark's are delighted to share some of the positive highlights from their recent SIAMS (Statutory Inspection of Anglican and Methodist Schools) inspection. Inspectors found that "love and respect are central" to life at the academy, and that changes to the curriculum have ensured that "pupils develop curiosity, enthusiasm for learning and are able to flourish".

Inspectors noted that "staff and pupils have been nurtured, involved and shown love and respect during this journey of improvement" since joining the Learning Academy Partnership, which has provided "quality training and advice" for the academy's staff. This training has fostered the development of the staff's teaching skills, further improving their ability to meet the learning needs of their pupils, whilst also ensuring the continuous growth of the academy as a Church of England school. Inspectors also remarked upon the Trust's support of the academy's "Christian distinctiveness".

Other key highlights from the report:

- Pupils are "nurtured and encouraged by the adults around them", with interactions
 anchored in "an understanding of the parables of the Good Samaritan and the Lost
 Sheep".
- Behaviour at the academy is good, as a result of pupils feeling "safe, loved and respected at school".
- Provisions for pupils' spiritual and mental wellbeing were praised, with pupils benefitting from the support of "skilled and highly trained teaching assistants", as well as the presence of numerous classroom reflection areas, quiet zones in the playground and 'worry boxes', which "enable pupils to be calm and reflect on their lives".
- The academy has close links with the local community. Pupils are enthusiastic about charitable fundraising and are involved in community activities, such as serving lunch to the elderly.

We are so proud to see this report highlighting the loving and respectful environment at St Mark's C of E Academy, informed by our Christian ethos and strengthened by our ties to the local community. We are very grateful to everyone who has played an integral role in building a culture of love and respect at our academy.
