The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 15th March 2023; in the Community Centre at 7:30pm. Present were: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), J Payne, N Steer, K Boundy, C Myers K Jones, R Savage and S Rosser (Clerk). Apologies were received and accepted from: Cllrs. J Phipps (Vice-Chair), G Worden, & S Tilbey

Parish matters & maintenance discussed such as: The installation of the Arbour at Crosstown – Cllr Savage and his Sons were thanked for installing the Arbour. The RoSPA report is due to take place on the play equipment in April. King Charles III Coronation details were discussed along with ideas of suitable memorabilia. A working party has been formed with the Community Centre Committee – this is set to be a wonderful weekend of events. A community emergency plan is being created - Cllrs. Phipps & Steer are hoping to present a draft version at the April meeting.

There is currently no news on the funding side of the 'The Health & Wellbeing Project'. An equality & diversity policy; along with a sustainable development policy were both implemented - as part of the funding bid.

A response was drafted for the Cornwall Council consultation on off street parking. The proposals were not supported.

Finances were agreed for payment and a secondary check of the previous month was carried out with the arrival of a duplicate bank statement.

There were two planning applications to provide consultee responses on. PA23/01289 - Proposed hay/straw, machinery, and occasional lambing building - Shears Farm Woodford Bude Cornwall EX23 9JD. MPC Comment: No objections. PA23/01324 - Proposed concrete slurry tower - Stursdon Farm Coombe Valley Bude Cornwall EX23 9HU - MPC Comment: No objection providing Environment Agency are satisfied

More than two million pieces of litter are dropped in the UK every day. The cost to the taxpayers for street cleaning is over £1 billion a year.

Litter is anything from a crisp packet or cigarette butt to a bag of rubbish. All litter is unsightly and makes our local areas look untidy and uncared for. Common litter items include fast-food packaging, sweet wrappers, drinks cans, bottles and cigarette butts

Litter does not clean itself away. It can take years to degrade, causing harm to wildlife and habitats. Food people drop – whether it is half-eaten burgers, chips or apple cores - can attract pigeons and vermin such as rats.

Research shows litter contributes to further crime and that people feel less safe in areas that are littered

Please do not litter. Use a bin for your rubbish and if you cannot find a bin, take your litter home with you.

Dropping litter is illegal. People who drop litter can be fined or face prosecution in court. Authorised officers have the power to issue a fixed penalty charge of up to £150 for a litter offence, as an alternative to prosecution. If the offender is prosecuted and convicted in court, the fine could rise to £2,500.

Woodford Community Garden

With the help of Woodford Chapel in January 2022 a group of locals set up WCG. The aim is to bring together the community through gardening, growing good fresh local produce that can be accessed by everyone - a food larder. Other aims are to improve physical and mental wellbeing and promote wildlife. One of the group, Neill Darling, has created a wonderful plan including a cornish knotted walkway, vegetable plot of raised bed, heb garden and a sitting area for contemplation,

Much has been achieved in the past year with the help of a generous grant from East Langford Solar Farm: the raised wooden beds have been built, a composting area created and the paths dug. In the next few weeks a recycled shed and new greenhouse will be arriving with disability accessible pathways being completed. As the garden was established in 2022 the veg beds were laid out in union jack pattern as a nod to the platinum jubilee and the jubilee oak tree was planted as a centrepiece to the quiet area.

We look forward to welcoming anyone interested in joining the group - we have recently started having a regular session on Saturday mornings and Tuesday afternoon/early evenings to work on the garden - why not drop in to say hello (just behind Woodford Chapel). Monday 8th May has been designated a 'Big Help Out Day ' all over the country, as a way of marking the Coronation ,and this will be a day when we are encouraging people to come along and volunteer.

Morwenstow Ceilidh/Dance Saturday 18th November 2023



Nature Notes

It's hard to believe that last summer's hosepipe ban is still in force. Although the smaller South West Water reservoirs have replenished to an acceptable level the largest one in Cornwall, Colliford needs a lot more rainfall to bring the level up. It begs the question, did someone forget to replace the bung!, or was there a mistake in the calculation for the size of the reservoir in relation to the rainfall over the catchment area?

What a wonderful display of snowdrops & daffodils over the last few weeks and now along the roadside verges the inconspicuous green flowers of dog mercury & alexanders, the later bought here by the Romans as a salad vegetable. I feel that this now common roadside plant at this time of year is the result of our milder winters because in my schooldays I do not remember seeing this plant.

On the ridges & cliffs the tiny white flowers of the blackthorn are emerging, always before the leaves & some years cover the bushes in a mass of white. It is often called a blackthorn winter and with a colder temperature can continue into May.

As a small boy I remember being told off by my mother for picking some sprigs of blackthorn covered in tiny white flowers and bringing them indoors, an omen of bad luck I was told. Somehow the name blackthorn and the fact that it's painful prickles are best avoided suggests a bush of evil intent unless of course you enjoy a tipple of sloe gin.
