# HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 21st July. Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair) S Tilbey, N Steer, C Myers, G Worden, J Phipps, K Boundy, K Jones, J Payne, R Savage & S Rosser (Clerk). One member of the public was present.

C.Cllr Tilbey gave a report. A Community Area Partnership (CAP) briefing took place on Monday regarding finding representatives for the funding panel. A member is needed from the Parish. Suggestion was made for Cllr Payne to fill the position. Some Towns/Parish's are ahead of the game with funding applications – Camelford is one of them. Sarah Ball (new CAP link officer) is due to be shown around the Parish on Friday by C. Cllr. Tilbey. A highway matter had previously been raised regarding LGV access via Woodville Road. Subsidence has been a problem. A road traffic order has been requested to remedy this; the Parish Council will be consulted when this is in the consultation period, requested as an item for the September agenda. Full council meet next week. Friday will see the rescheduled Devon & Cornwall Crime Panel meeting – request any policing issues to be brought forward. It was requested to ask when we will have a Liaison Officer for the Parish.

The usual monthly matters of parish maintenance were covered. The recent launch week of the Tamara Project saw incredibly bad weather, the walk was however completed. The marker stone has been installed in the nearest safe place to the start of the Tamar. Details of the walk will be available on the website and in the Hamlets in due course. The project was funded by English Heritage with match funding from Cornwall Council and Devon County Council.

The community emergency plan will be available in its first draft format for the September meeting. Thanks go to Cllrs. Steer & Phipps.

The Health & Wellbeing Project update is regrettably that the objection lodged by Sport England, cannot be overcome. Plans need to be re-thought. The Steering Group will meet on Tuesday 25th July to assess the next steps. A public meeting will be arranged in due course. The fitness equipment is due to be installed by the end of July, and will be available throughout the summer. The Tommy Tractor installation will not be far behind it.

Five planning applications were considered: PA23/04221 – Construction of five detached dwellings – Land East of West Beckon Close Shop Morwenstow Cornwall. MPC Comments: The comments of Morwenstow Parish Council are very similar to the previous application. We are concerned about vehicular access to the proposed development. The proposed access uses a road that will run through an area of granted detailed planning, that has not yet commenced on the ground. Given that it is a large development of family homes; we still felt that access would be better suited to the North, rather than through West Beckon Close. This could facilitate safe access to the primary school, shop and playing fields. Consideration should be given to a footpath through to the school.

Concern is still raised about the direction of water travel. With the increase in extreme weather events due to climate change; the Parish Council seek reassurance relating to the capacity of the proposed SUDS system. Particularly that its ability to cope with potential flooding; which would affect the neighbouring properties. It must be sufficient to accommodate and alleviate this. The design is felt to be appropriate.

PA23/04333 - Internal layout amendments and enclosure of rear courtyard. Eastaway Manor Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9JQ. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council have no objections.

PA23/04334 - Listed building consent for internal layout amendments and enclosure of rear courtyard. Eastaway Manor Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9JQ. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council have no objections.

PA23/04971 - Erection of a polytunnel Land West of Nor Park Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9PP

MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council have no objections.

PA23/05690 - Certificate of lawfulness for the existing use to confirm the lawful use of land as residential curtilage from 1984 - 2009. Land between Foxhaven and Meadow View Eastcott Bude Cornwall.

MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council feel that appeal decision APP/D0840/W/16/3163814 remains valid. We now consider this to be a legal case and leave it to Cornwall Council to determine.

The next regular Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 20th September 2023. If a planning meeting is necessary before this – it will take place on the first Wednesday of the month. All are welcome to the meetings.

## **NATURE NOTES**

At this time of year birds and animals venture out with their youngsters & if you find a quiet spot to sit and wait for them to come to you, the young ones can be quite inquisitive before they have built up their sense of fear. Fox cubs being one of the prime examples of this.

The three deer species, Roe, Fallow & Red have a good sense of smell and will soon let you know if they detect your scent, but their eyesight is not what you would expect and they react more to movement and noise, hence to stay still and quiet can be more rewarding.

A few years ago, I had a "once in a lifetime" when I heard what I thought what I thought was a hen pheasant clucking, coming closer along the hedge bottom, when suddenly a mother stoat appeared by the gatepost, looked straight at me just a couple of paces away and continued clucking, when five youngsters followed her across the gateway like a train & up onto the hedge behind the other gatepost. I thought, lovely, I just happened to be in the right place at the right time, when there was then a rumpus on top of the hedge. The stoats were chasing a rabbit around in circles when suddenly the rabbit dashed out into the field and sat down as if mesmerised. The stoats did not follow the rabbit, but continued looking for it on the top of the hedge, then mother stoat clucked an order and they all followed her back across the gateway within a few inches of my toes. Even better! What a lucky bunny!

On some roadside verges & hedges nearer to the moorland where the soil is acidic, Rose Bay Willow Herb has given a red brick blanket effect, although a native of Canada it is not as invasive as Japanese Knotweed or Himalayan Balsom which every year are an increasing threat.

Locally, blackberries, sloes & hazel nuts are showing great promise for natures free wild harvest.
