HAMLETS

An extra planning meeting was held on Wednesday 7th December 2022; in the Community Centre at 2:00pm. Present were: Cllrs. Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chairman), J Phipps (Vice-Chair), K Boundy, G Worden, R Savage, S Rosser (Clerk) & two members of the public. Apologies for absence received by: Cllrs. C Myers, J Payne, S Tilbey, K Jones & N Steer.

The following applications were considered: PA22/09580 Proposal: Construction of a single agricultural workers dwelling Location: Land West of Meadowside Morwenstow Bude Cornwall. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council felt that there is a social and economic need for this proposal. It is viewed as appropriate in size and not of excessive scale. Morwenstow Parish Council are happy to support this application

5 – day protocol response required: PA22/08956 & PA22/08773 Proposal: Listed Building Consent for Garden Office situated within the grounds east of the site & listed building consent for the same. Location: The Old Malt House, Shop Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9SJ. MPC Comment: Option 1 – Agree to agree with the officer.

PA22/09924 Proposal: Provision of extension to south elevation of existing stables / store to provide additional storage area, insertion of three rooflights in south facing roof plane and insertion of window in north elevation of building (all previously carried out without consent) Location: Crosslands Shop Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9PE. MPC Comments: Following the report of the site visit from the Planning Officer; Morwenstow Parish Council are happy to support this application, with the 'equestrian only - not residential' condition as per the guidance of the Officer.

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 18th January 2023; in the Community Centre at 7:45pm. Present were: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), J Phipps (Vice-Chair), J Payne, N Steer, G Worden, K Boundy, C Myers K Jones, R Savage & S Tilbey and S Rosser (Clerk). Three members of the Public were also present.

This was a busy meeting as there is no December meeting. Parish matters & maintenance discussed such as: King Charles III Coronation. Salt bin request, an update from Engie.com on the currently broken turbine. The merits of engaging a litter picker and the Parish Council having a dedicated social media account, an update on the future preservation of the old Tithe maps from Cllr. Worden. The Oak trees having been registered under 'The Queen's Green Canopy' project. Lastly the need for emergency repairs to the flagpole.

A community emergency plan will be created with the guidance of Cllrs. Phipps & Steer. Cornwall Council are requesting that all Town's and Parish's carry out this action.

It was agreed to support Holsworthy Rural Transport with the request for £250 per year for the next three years. They provide a ring and ride service in the Community.

The third meeting for the 'Health & Wellbeing Project' (comprising of a multi-use games area, outdoor fitness suite, multi-use pump track & electric vehicle charging) took place the week before the Council meeting. Extensive work has taken place on the grant application by the steering group; the application has since been submitted to the Cornwall Council – Community Levelling Up Fund. There is a new page for this on the Parish website.

The following planning application was discussed: PA22/10660 Application for Outline Planning Permission with some matters reserved for the construction of a dwelling namely access only. | Land Between Foxhaven and Meadow View Eastcott Morwenstow Bude EX23 9PL

MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council feel that appeal decision APP/D0840/W/16/3163814 remains valid; and do not feel that any significant changes are brought by this application.

Nature Notes

On New Years Day after parking at the bottom of Stowe Hill we walked the permissive path up through the woods coming onto the road opposite the farm entrance at Stowe Barton. We were surprised to see some fully developed hazel catkins & on the verge opposite the fleshy leaves of comfrey were emerging, a reminder of when the farmer of 60 years ago planted a small area of this plant just over the hedge where it grew into a dense leafy crop and by the time the silage clamp had been filled with grass, then the comfrey was cut with the forage harvester which resulted in a mushy sealant to spread over the grass and preserve it.

Walking down the road a short distance to the corner & in the woodland track, a favourite place for dog walkers, and on down under the tall mostly native trees, where you may be lucky enough to see woodpeckers, tree creepers and nuthatches.

Still walking down and keeping to the left, crossing two rivers & coming up to the long straight footpath that leads back to Combe. Going through the pedestrian gate, quite a few spindle bushes, yet to shed their pale green leaves, were most noticeable as most of the other trees were bare. Back in the summer the spindle with darker leaves & very few of their red triangular berries, they blended in so well that unless you really looked for them you would not have known that spindle was growing here.

At the end of the level part of the path with the mill building on the left some stone slabs on the surface, under which the water flowed to the millpond from the leat which sourced its water from the valley to the north. Rather than going down to the road at the end of the path, there are some uneven steps leading past the mill pond & through the orchard & over the foot bridge back to the very convenient parking spot.

Walking through the orchard we noticed apples still on one tree & the grass strewn with windfalls which the birds enjoy. We have found that the blackbirds that come to our garden do appreciate the apples to be spiked onto a cane about 6ins high with a sliver of peel cut off opposite sides and by the end of the next day only the shell of peel is left to go into the compost bin.
