HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 21st June. Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair) S Tilbey, N Steer, C Myers, G Worden, J Phipps, K Boundy & S Rosser (Clerk). Apologies for absence were received from: Cllrs. K Jones, J Payne & R Savage. No members of the public were present.

Matters arising from the last meeting covered the mechanics of the new joint role of 'Planning Application Advisor' that will be carried out by Cllrs. Myers & Jones. The deadline for inclusion of agenda items was pointed out with the importance highlighted that discussion may not take place unless the item is on the agenda.

C.Cllr Tilbey gave a report of a few meetings that he had attended most recently. First being for Stratton Minor Injuries Unit, he reported a continuation of service and a focus for educating service users to use the 111 service in the first instance. Second meeting was of North Kernow Community Land Trust (NKCLT) this was to identify need for social housing. The meeting was well attended. C. Cllr. Tilbey had also attended the inaugural Bude & Camelford Community Area Partnership (CAP). This meeting was also attended by the Chair, Vice-Chair & Clerk. It was felt to be a generally positive meeting overall.

The usual monthly matters of parish maintenance were covered. An update had been received regarding the Tamara Project. There will be a launch week, Morwenstow will be the end destination for the last 12-mile leg from Upper Tamar Lake to Marsland Mouth on Saturday 15th July. A request was received from 'The Roaming Restaurant' to trade from the Community Centre Carpark on occasion. Look out for more details of that.

The community emergency plan is moving along nicely, driven by Cllrs. Phipps & Steer.

The Health & Wellbeing Project has hit a hurdle in the granting of planning permission. Sport England have objected to the application; the steering group is meeting to see how these objections can be overcome. The acoustic assessment had been positive and was due to be signed off that week. We are pleased to report the successful grant award for the 'Tommy Tractor' from the East Youlstone Wind Turbine Fund. Thank you to Denise May MBE for her action on that project.

Cllr Ken Boundy is stepping down from his long-term role with Morwenstow United Charities. Cllr Christine Myers is to replace him, as Parish Council representative.

Acknowledgment of receipt was returned for the Councils own planning application number: PA23/01922 - without comments to add, as it would be inappropriate to do so. A planning notice was also received for PA23/04221 - Construction of five detached dwellings - Land East of West Beckon Close Shop Morwenstow. This was deferred to the July meeting; with the approval of the Planning Officer, as there was not sufficient time to look at plans after receipt.

NATURE NOTES

The most recent New Moon was on the 18th June, the weather was still settled as it had been for some weeks. The previous two New Moon dates were similar which could suggest that the present run of good weather will continue for some time. Could it be that the seasons are becoming more predictable, but we are all aware that dry spells mean water shortages. We have become used to turning on the tap, not aware it is a natural resource and must be used responsibly.

I can remember when drinking water was dipped out of a well & carried back to the kitchen, or as with our family at West Milton a semi rotary hand pump over the covered well in an outhouse, but you had to remember to take a jug of water in case the pump needed priming.

During the last month a lot of birds have reared their offspring and the youngsters have taken to the wing, unfortunately it is their only flight when cats and plate glass windows are in their flight path. Even when they are growing into adulthood, they run the risk of being predated by larger birds to feed their offspring.

Nature has created a balance with the smaller birds who suffer most predation laying more eggs & rear more fledglings to ensure that some will survive the first year and become breeding adults.

For the wild birds that visit our gardens it is essential to provide a shallow dish of water for drinking & bathing, crumbs & mealworms will entice them to visit. But the downside to this is that the Shop house sparrows are partial to the tender young laves of beetroot, peas & lettuce
