HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 20th September. Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), N Steer, C Myers, G Worden, J Phipps, K Boundy, J Payne, R Savage & S Rosser (Clerk). Two members of the public were present. Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr. K Jones & C.Cllr. S Tilbey.

The usual monthly matters of parish maintenance were covered. The section of highway near Shop (mentioned in the planning application below) will be highlighted once more to Cornwall Council Highways. Discussion was held regarding the Village Greens in the Parish. In order to help the Parish Council establish projected costs for 2024/25 – it was resolved to request an expression of interest from Contractors for usual yearly works.

The Health & Wellbeing Project steering group met as planned, a new way forward has been found and approved by the Councillors. This consists of a smaller tarmac court being installed in the land below the football training pitch – this would facilitate netball/basketball/tennis/badminton. The pump track would shrink considerably; and surfacing would become a stone surface, being dedicated to bikes. A new area could be taken in above the training pitch for a dedicated skating facility. A public meeting is due to take place on Monday 9th October at 7:30pm at the Community Centre – please attend.

The pros and cons of implementing a Neighbourhood Plan for Morwenstow were debated. It was resolved to wait until November 2024; when a replacement 'Neighbourhood Priority Statement' will be rolled out instead.

Two planning applications were considered:

PA23/05202 | The erection of an agricultural storage shed | Land at Shop Bude EX23 9SQ

MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council would like to be able to support any business going forward; but have reservations about this application.

We feel that access is completely unsuitable; and in fact, dangerous. We ask that Highways do not use a desktop survey, but attend a site meeting with the Parish Councillors. The map does not represent the current state of overgrown foliage; which is a result of the neglect for maintenance over many years by the custodian of the overall site

We feel that the building suitable for agriculture - as it is, is large for the small amount of acreage there is at the site. We feel that the County Land Agent should be consulted to ascertain whether the finances produced, are in fact viable. The Parish Council has shown concerns going forward that the business may struggle, therefore leaving opportunity for the building to become a 'Q Application'. This could set a precedent for the other 34 enclosures on this site, of somewhat sporadic development.

There does not appear to be any yellow site notice displayed; one may have been present, but is no longer and hasn't been there for the required statutory timescale. We would like to bring an enforcement investigation case to your attention from May of this year - reference: EN23/00592.

Recommendations from the pre application advice from 2021 were to consult with Morwenstow Parish Council and the Ward Member. No consultation with the Parish Council has taken place, regarding any proposal going forward.

PA23/07039 | Proposed extensions | Ciseley Woodford Bude Cornwall EX23 9JD.

MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council would firstly like to note that the owner of this property, carries out work from time to time for the Parish Council.

Having reviewed the plans, Morwenstow Parish Council do not have any objections.

A third application was received but sufficient time was not available to follow the due process for assessing the application. PA23/05306 | Phased residential development for 4 new dwellings. | Land West of Woodridge Woolley Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9PW.

The Tamara Coast to Coast Way, a new 87-mile walking route that stretches between the South and North coast in the South-West is now open, thanks to the Tamara Landscape Partnership Scheme and funded by The National Lottery Heritage Fund.

The 7-day walking route broadly follows the River Tamar, the historic boundary between Devon and Cornwall from sea to source, before continuing on to the North coast. It begins at Cremyll, overlooking Plymouth Sound and finishes at Marsland Mouth near Morwenstow. Linking the two coasts has also created a new 387-mile circular walking route around the border of Cornwall, *Kylgh Kernow*, Cornish for Circuit of Cornwall.

Highlights of the Tamara Coast to Coast Way include unspoilt river-valley landscapes in the Tamar Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty and the Cornwall and West Devon Mining World Heritage Site. Many short walks have also been developed along the route to enable more people to benefit physically and mentally from time spent in the great outdoors.

Will Darwall, Manager of the Tamara Landscape Partnership Scheme said:

"The creation of this stunningly beautiful new long-distance walking route will inspire people to get out there and experience this wonderful part of the country. People can now not only enjoy a largely overlooked natural landscape, but the walkers will also benefit local enterprises along the way, such as local B&Bs. Just get your walking boots on and go!"

Stuart McLeod, Director of England - London & South at The National Lottery Heritage Fund, said:

"It's wonderful to see the opening of the Tamara Coast to Coast Way, providing walkers from the area and visitors from further afield with a fantastic new way of discovering the Tamar Valley and immersing themselves in its inspiring natural heritage. We're thrilled that thanks to money raised by National Lottery players, we have been able to support the creation of this brilliant new walking route and are sure that many players will use it to explore and discover the beautiful natural heritage surrounding it."

Martin Howlett, Chair of the Tamar Valley Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty said:

"My fellow farmers and landowners welcome the official opening up of the entire length of the River Tamar Valley from 'source to sea' as one designated route, whilst offering a golden opportunity to both local walkers and visitors alike to explore, enjoy and truly appreciate the best of the Westcountry, its farming and natural environment, working in harmony within this special & unique landscape."

Lorna Sherriff, National Trail Officer for the South West Coast Path Association said:

"It's great to have this new coast to coast route which has enabled the Kylgh Kernow to be formed, linking in with the South West Coast Path to make a circular route around the whole of Cornwall. The coast to coast route provides people with the opportunity to explore and walk through more of the stunning South West landscape to connect with nature and the heritage found in the Tamar valley."

NATURE NOTES

I hope you have made use of natures "food bank" with a plentiful supply of quality blackberries which benefit families in three ways.

- 1. Exercise to walk around & find where the best ones grow
- 2. Identifying the hedgerow plants & flowers and thereby a hands-on risk assessment of bramble bushes & stinging nettles!
- 3. Enjoying the fruit tarts and if you find you have picked more than you need, they can be frozen for later use. Also, with the equinoxial gales in the weather forecast windfall apples area useful addition if you can find the good ones before the birds, slugs, and wasps damage them.

Most deciduous trees are holding on to their leaves which make them more vulnerable to being blown down and causing damage, but we must hope that autumnal colours will appear after some more settled weather.

The Red Deer rut starts during October & if you have never heard or seen the stags during the rut it is quite a chilling experience. The roaring can be heard a mile away, but to watch, it is better to use binoculars at a safe distance, giving them space to round up their hinds.

Spiders seek warmer accommodation as the temperature drops and with the sun lower in the sky the sight of their webs can cause distress for some people. However, a deterrent is to place conkers in the corners of rooms and under heavy furniture that doesn't get moved. I think they are more effective if the outer skin is pierced with a skewer, but I am open to other suggestions
