HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 16th October 2024.

Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair) J Phipps, K Boundy, N Steer, C Myers, K Jones, R Savage, J Payne, G Worden, C. Cllr. S Tilbey and the Clerk.

C.Cllr. Tilbey gave a report of the local and wider issues in the area, relating to planning breaches and traffic issues.

Discussion took place of many different Parish matters. Four policies were reviewed and approved. Further information is also being sought on the government initiative of moving all Parish Councils to gov.uk domain names for various reasons including cyber security.

The Health & Wellbeing Project is in full swing. The first stage of the pump track installation has been completed. The second stage will be to tarmac this and complete the landscaping.

The construction of the Multi Use Games Area is also underway. There has been an additional requirement for a retaining wall; but this is all in hand, with the construction of that now complete as I write this. There will in due course be a grand opening event; but details are not yet confirmed – please look out for details early in the New Year. Three members of the steering group have now also been interviewed as part of the video that is being produced – as mentioned in last months Hamlets.

Correspondence was received from Cornwall Council to notify us that street lights in Morwenstow will be switched off between midnight and 5am before the end of October. This is part of a wider roll out scheme that has already been in place in other parts of the County.

No planning applications were received for consideration this month.

New waste service starts in North East Cornwall from Monday 4 November

24 October 2024

We start the new weekly food waste and fortnightly rubbish collection service from 4 **November** for people living in North East Cornwall.

You and your community will be adopting this important new service, which we're putting in place to help people reduce waste and increase recycling, for a more thriving and sustainable Cornwall.

We'll change the collections of approximately 55,000 households in Padstow, Wadebridge, Bodmin, Camelford, Tintagel, Launceston, Bude and surrounding areas over a two-week period.

The date of each household's first collection on the new service will vary according to where they live in North East Cornwall and where their property sits in our new collection schedule.

People can find their new collection day in the 'Go!' Collection Calendar we posted to them in October or by going to www.cornwall.gov.uk/myarea and entering their address.

The next phase of an initiative to reduce carbon emissions, cut light pollution to help nature recovery and encourage nocturnal wildlife, protect our designated Dark Skies areas, and save money on energy costs, is being rolled out.

The Council is turning off some of its streetlights when most residents are asleep between the hours of midnight and 5am. Streetlights in town centres where there is a strong night-time economy, areas where there is CCTV, and along main roads, will remain on or will be dimmed.

Residents can see for themselves where and when streetlights will be turned off or dimmed between the hours of midnight and 5am with an interactive map on the Council website.

Streetlights will remain on, or be dimmed between midnight and 5am to reduce light pollution, in locations such as

- Traffic signal junctions, pedestrian crossings, subways, some roundabouts and junctions
- Parts of town centres and footpaths that are still relatively busy during the night
- . On certain roads where there is traffic calming and speed humps
- · Areas where there is CCTV or police surveillance equipment
- · Entrances and exits to hospitals, police, ambulance and fire stations

Our vast network of streetlights currently contributes to around 30% of the council's total carbon emissions.

Carbon reduction is a primary driver for taking action to replace streetlights and turn them off or dim them when appropriate.

All <u>Council-run streetlights in Cornwall are in the process of being replaced</u> with energy saving LEDs as part of a programme to cut carbon emissions, as well as reduce electricity consumption. The new LED streetlights, which are a similar colour temperature to the previous lamps, will be remotely controlled and monitored. Using low power technology, the streetlights can be adapted to the needs of local areas.

Another word from Rev Richard for November

November is the month of Remembrance. The days are lovely, but sad. The leaves fall, as does the rain, and there are times of shining sun. It used to be the time for the burning of leaves when I was a boy, but all that has stopped nowadays. The month when we look back as the year fades towards the end.

We muster at the memorial and hear the words by the librarian poet Laurence Binyon which recall to us the Western Front massacres. "They shall not grow old as we that are left grow old." As a boy, I used to think that those soldiers would have found this cold comfort and they would have much rather have enjoyed a nice long life at home. But they went nevertheless.

It is the month of the poppy. The continuous shelling had unearthed long dead seeds and what had appeared in those Flanders fields were thousands of poppies. Our emblematic poppy, the one we proudly wear, was captured in a poem by Isaac Rosenberg called "Break of Day in the trenches." One line explains that a rat touches his hand, "As I pull the parapet's poppy to stick behind my ear." Buried in Westminster Abbey is the tomb of the unknown warrior. The grave contains the body of an unknown British soldier from the First World War. The body was brought from France on 11th November 1920 intended for those whose loved one was amongst the "unknown" who had never returned. Perhaps the family may feel that in the tomb there may be- there is - resting, the body of their loved one.

The tragedy in remembering is that certain memories are not powerful enough to alter the circumstances of today. It is suggested that we never learn from history and in so doing we are doomed to make the same mistakes. We need to hold these Remembrances and poems and poppies as sign posts where we can honour the dead - serve the living - and build the common good.
