HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 19th June 2024. Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair) J Phipps, K Boundy, G Worden, N Steer, C Myers, J Payne, K Jones, C. Cllr. S Tilbey & the Clerk. Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr. R Savage.

Further discussion took place around the request for a 'Hawker Country' sign. No decision has been taken but again more ideas discussed and more required. Various highway matters were also noted along with the usual matters of Parish maintenance. The top coat of painting at the public toilets will take place before 3rd July.

The D-Day beacon marking the anniversary of the Landings on Thursday 6th June took place. This was felt to be well received by the Parishioners. There were a few other beacons visible from Beacon Down, not nearly as many as had been lit for the late Queen's Jubilee celebrations.

Two planning applications were considered: PA24/03618 | Non-material amendment in relation to decision notice PA23/08701 dated 21/12/2023 for amendment to external materials namely, replacing stone render. Removal of 2no. roof lights | Lowena Woodford Bude Cornwall EX23 9JD. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council support the non-material amendment.

PA24/01303 | The construction of a two-storey extension to replace an existing one-storey extension on the Eastern elevation of the house. | 3 Morwenna Road Shop Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9SW. MPC Comments: Morwenstow Parish Council would like to support this application. However, the first-floor window of bedroom 1 will be in close proximity of the neighbouring property. The Council would like to request that this window of obscure glazing to prevent the loss of amenity, or perhaps to switch to a velux window. Thank you.

A 5 day protocol request had been received prior to the meeting for: PA24/01890 | Replacement of structurally unstable cottage with new dwelling. | Sunnyside Gooseham Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9PG. Members agreed with the officer decision to approve.

Our Y5/6 pupils thoroughly enjoyed a 3-day residential at PGL Beamhouse

Without opening our children's eyes to what is out there in the wider world, they will not be able to know what they can achieve!"

They engaged in a range of different activities, pushed themselves out of their comfort zone and all gave 100%. The instructors and all the staff at PGL loved the St Mark's children and were blown away by their impeccable behaviour and incredible manners. Memories for our children that will last a lifetime!

A Christening party: God's magnificent gift for all the family.

Last Sunday afternoon at M'stow church, a wonderful event took place. We christened a beautiful baby and welcomed her into the family of the church. Fifty-five close family members and friends, stood all around to encircle and greet Mum and Dad and Sister and the Baby, with their love to welcome her into her new life in the church. And of course, the three God parents, there to give their support and encouragement.

The baby was perfect, (all babies are) dressed in the family's traditional baptismal outfit. She only cried when I splashed her with water. But who wouldn't? (In times past this was thought of as seeing off the Devil.) Well, she did that all right!

This ceremony is packed full of symbols right from the start. It all takes place around the font, which is usually sited near the door, symbolising the beginning of her journey of life. To mark this, I gave her a scallop shell, the symbol of a pilgrim, with her name and date on it. I earlier mentioned water from our own holy St John's well. And with this lovely cleansing and growing symbol, we named the child, as a way of saying that she belongs not just to us, but to God as well. (At this point always have a child nearby to help dry the baby off... a dabber!)

Following on, I marked the sign of the cross on the baby's forehead with a special, sweet-smelling oil (blessed by the Bishop, no less.) This is the sign of Jesus Christ and although it is invisible, we can tell the child later that it is there and hopefully, she will live in a way that shows she belongs to God. After this there is one last thing to do and that is to give the child a lighted candle. (Waving it carefully in front of her is always a way to get a smile.) Of course, this symbolises Jesus, the light of the World. (I pray that His light will show her the way to go.) This candle is something to get out over the next anniversary years and to wave about and remember. I like to think that she will shine with the light of God every day of her life and so make the world around her a brighter, better place. (And I surely believe that she will.) At this moment it is time for the child and her parents to have a tour around the gathering to sort of get meet and greet everyone. (More careful candle waving too!)

So, to close this very lovely, little service of joy, I pray naturally, for the parents, that they may love and care for the child and be a wonderful example as she grows up in the world. Then the God parents, that they will do a good job. And finally, the whole gathering from the oldest to the youngest, who are there to circle us all, and be blessed with God's love. So, everyone is prayed for and blessed.

Family gatherings tend to linger and chat for quite a while afterwards, catching up and stuff, before they realise that down at the Community Hall there is a cream tea waiting. Need I say more?


