The recent RoSPA reports for the playground equipment and the newly installed fitness equipment were noted with any remedial action being resolved. A request has been made to the Parish Council for a 'Hawker Country' sign. This is being considered, further information is required.

There will be a beacon to mark the anniversary of the D-Day Landings on Thursday 6th June. This will be lit at 9:15pm. Please do look out for the display across the counties that will be visible.

The Internal Audit report was received; with all necessary protocol being followed, in order to submit the AGAR documentation to the External Auditor.

However, we would like to see more retention of what was originally there. When I was a boy, I used to love "The Beano" with Mini the minx, Biffo the Bear, Roger the Dodger and even Billy Whizz! But gradually I moved onto "the Eagle". I enjoyed the thought of Dan Dare confronting the evil Mekon and then there was PC 49 solving crimes with the Bash Street Kids. Somewhere in between there was Popeye rescuing Olive Oil from the nefarious Bluto, but somehow gradually, I left them all behind and became fascinated by explorers and climbers. Wilson and Shackleton of the Antarctic and Ed Hillary climbing Everest. Wow! And many others, they just kept coming.

This week I have discovered another man who I consider to be a hero. In this case, a saint called Brendan. He lived around c486 and felt the call from God to build a boat, using only leather and struts, (like a coracle), and sail off to where he believed God was leading him.
