HAMLETS

The monthly meeting of the Parish Council was held on Wednesday 21st February. Attended by: Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair) J Phipps (Vice-Chair) K Boundy, G Worden, N Steer, C Myers, J Payne, K Jones, R Savage, S Tilbey & the Clerk – S Rosser.

The usual matters maintenance discussed included: a response from Oliver Jones of Cornwall. Completion of the tree log, playpark log, fitness equipment and overall grounds logs. Notification and acceptance of the Cornwall Council offer towards the upkeep of the South West Coast Path and the Local Maintenance Partnership. Noticeboard repairs and the toilets both at the Playing Fields and Duckpool were discussed. Cllr. Jones has been tasked with completing the 'Invasive Species Survey' PLEASE SEE PAGES 5 & 6 FOR DETAILS ON HOW YOU CAN CONTRIBUTE TO THIS.

We are able to report some positive news as hoped for 'The Health & Well Being Project'. Planning permission PA23/08585 - has now been granted. There is also some negative news unfortunately. The approval was not given on the plans as originally submitted. The Steering Group had to make a disappointing decision; to omit the separate skate park from the project (at this stage), to respect the opinions of other members of the Parish. Funding bids will now be progressed, to deliver this project.

The National Civility & Respect pledge certificate was signed and dated by the Chairman.

With kind permission of the landowner – a beacon will be lit to mark the D-Day celebrations on 6th June 2024 at Beacon Down.

Three planning applications were considered:

PA23/10091 | Erection of an agricultural building. | Land North East of Woolley Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9PW

MPC Comments: The Parish Council would like to be able to support any application for a new business venture. However; we have concerns over the siting location, and the suitability of the proposed building to keep livestock. Access from the highway to the proposed building can only be afforded by the construction of a purpose-built track, which is not mentioned within this application. The lack of ventilation of this building would make it inappropriate for its indicated intended purpose. The Parish Council would not feel comfortable with the approval of this application without reassurance from the Planning Officer that they have had sight of all appropriate licensing documents. Such as: a CPH Holding number; Flock & Herd numbers etc, along with having seen the details of any appointed veterinary professionals. A farm assurance scheme visit would also be well received.

The Parish Council would welcome site visits from the Officers involved, including Highways. Thank you.

MPC Comments: The Parish Council feel unable to make any comment on this application, due to the lack of information provided. We would request further details from the applicant to understand the need for this new barn, along with a re-consultation please. Thank you.

P3 PA24/00899 | The erection of an agricultural storage shed. | Land at Shop Bude EX23 9SQ

MPC Comments: The Parish Council do not feel that a great deal has changed from application PA23/05202. Whilst the shed size has been reduced, with some signs having been put up on the road hedge bank - nothing is very different. We would like to request that the County Land Agent be consulted. We seek information on the field grading for this particular piece of land. We are uncertain that the soil here is suited to the intended purpose, of which is more commonly found in the Mediterranean climate. We again request site visits from the Planning Officer and Highways. Thank you.

Tamar Catchment - Invasive Non-Native Species Questionnaire

The Tamar Valley National Landscape Partnership is seeking information on the presence and spread of Giant hogweed, Japanese knotweed, Himalayan balsam and American skunk cabbage in the wider river catchment.

As much of the recruitment of seeds or viable plant fragments wash down rivers, it is important to understand their extent in the wider catchment from which new invasive plants may enter the lower reaches of the river and estuary.

We are therefore looking for help in identifying where these four plant species are upstream and in what numbers. For this we need to tap the knowledge of local people and societies within the Tamar Catchment area and are looking for participants to share their information with us.

This up-to-date information will help to inform a feasibility study that has been commissioned for the possible development of a control programme.

Information about the four species of principal interest can be found at Plant Atlas 2020.




St. Mark's C of E Academy
