# HAMLETS

The monthly Parish Council meeting was held on Wednesday 21st July in the Community Centre. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), K Boundy, J Phipps, R Savage and S Tilbey, 5 members of the public and Mrs S Joyner (Clerk).

Cllr. Tilbey confirmed that Stratton Hospital would remain open for the current hours for longer than had been planned. This is to give time for the Bude/Holsworthy Cross Border Health Committee to gather data for discussion before the next meeting which will be held on  $29_{th}$  September 2021.

It was agreed that the toilets outside the Community Centre will be re-opened as soon as the cleaner has carried out a deep clean. The toilets at Duckpool will remain closed as the council has not been able to find a cleaner. The National Trust and Kilkhampton Parish Council have been advised.

5 co-option applications to fill the vacant seats on the Parish Council had been received and were discussed. It was resolved to accept all 5 of the candidates. Congratulations were extended to Greg Worden, Kevin Jones, Nigel Steer, Matthew Hodgson and Jaik Payne. The new Councillors will take up their seats at the September meeting. The Council are still looking for a new Clerk and an advertisement has been placed on the website and the noticeboard.

A quote to carry out repair works to some of the playpark equipment had been received and was accepted. Work will start shortly. Quotes are required for repairs to some of the fence posts at the playpark, details inside Hamlets. It was confirmed that a council bench that was missing from outside the Parish Church had been removed as it was unsafe. The Parish Council had been unaware of this and the provision of a replacement bench will be discussed at a future meeting.

There were 6 planning applications discussed: PA21/05639; Removal of three wooden garden sheds/outbuildings and replacement with one larger wooden garden shed/outbuilding, 2 Chapel Close Woodford:PA21/04807; Change of use of two holiday cottages to unrestricted residential use free from occupancy restrictions, Land West of Killarney Farm Morwenstow: PA21/06309; Erection of a detached double domestic garage, 2 Jacques Cottages Shop Morwenstow. The Parish Council were in support of these 3 applications. The following 3 applications were not supported: PA21/05495; Reserved Matters application for appearance, landscaping, layout and scale following approval of outline application PA19/05328 dated 16 10 19 (outline application for the erection of a dwelling), Westlands Shop Morwenstow: PA21/05612; Proposed dwelling (demolition of existing dwelling), Killarney Springs Morwenstow; PA21/06671; Erection of dwelling, Land North of 3 Jacques Cottages Shop Morwenstow.

The next meeting will be the monthly Parish Council meeting to be held on Wednesday 15th September at 7.30pm in the Community Centre, unless an interim planning meeting needs to be held. If this is the case the meeting will be held on the 4th August or the 1st September and the details will be published on the notice board and on the website.
