The monthly Parish Council meeting was held on Wednesday 20th April 2022 in the Community Centre. Present were Cllrs. J Hobbs (Chair), K Boundy, J Phipps, R Savage, J Payne, N Steer, G Worden & K Jones, four members of the public and S Rosser (Clerk). Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr Tilbey.

Platinum Jubilee Celebration Oak trees have been planted in each Hamlet; wild flower seeds have also been sown. Parishioners have been registering for the commemorative mugs. Please register with Councillor Phipps, if you have not done so already. Children yet to be born in this Jubilee year are also entitled to receive a mug. Co-option of the Parish Councillor Vacancy is expected to take place at the May meeting.

PA22/02570, Proposed conversion and extension of barn to create a dwelling/holiday let, Cornakey Farm Morwenstow Bude Cornwall EX23 9SS - Morwenstow Parish Council support this application. PA21/06671, Erection of annexe ancillary to 3 Jacques Cottages, Land North of 3 Jacques Cottages Morwenna Road Shop - Morwenstow Parish Council welcome the alterations, of which enable the Council to now support this application. However, the Parish Council would like to reiterate the issue of loss of street parking; and would be pleased to see the inclusion of obscured glass in the South facing doors.

PA22/03314, Full application for the construction of five detached dwellings, land north of The Nook, Morwenna Road, Shop. This was received the day before the meeting. An extension of time was requested and granted, in order to consider the documents fully for the May meeting.

The next regular Parish Council meeting will be the annual general meeting; held on Wednesday 18th May 2022.

Morwenstow Women's Institute Annual Meeting

Wednesday 13th April 2022

Members met in the community centre to hear Alan Rowland talking about 'Discovering Lundy'. Illustrated by many slides he spoke enthusiastically about the archaeology, history and flora and fauna of this beautiful place. Lundy is thought to derive from old Scandinavian languages and means Puffin Island. The puffins are thriving again since the rats were removed and it is also a haven for other seabirds, most importantly the Manx shearwater. It is also the site of rare Romano-British gravestones, a number of bronze age stone circles and a bronze age round house where it is believed St Nectan was buried before his bones were removed to Hartland. Trinity House built a lighthouse and access road there in 1812 and at one time the owner, a rogue of an MP, made loads of money transporting prisoners there instead of to Australia and graffiti can still be seen in Benson's Cave, where they were forced to live. Lundy has the oldest private postal service in Britain and prints its own postage stamps, which are very sought after by collectors. A truly unique place to visit or even stay for a few days.
